# Annual survey of library services to schools and children

## Regional supplement 2005-06

### Introduction

This year, MLA has again commissioned a supplement to the main report of LISU's annual survey of library services to schools and children, giving a regional breakdown of the detailed data for those eight English regions not distinguished in the main report.

This supplement does not include any commentary on the results, or detailed comments from the authorities and services included, although notes appended to the tables have been repeated here. Readers should refer to the main report for further detail.

The tables included here are all the detailed tables from sections 2, 3 and 4 of the main report, and Appendix A. They are numbered to correspond with the main report, and a separate list of tables is not given. In each case, two or three regions are presented on a page, with appropriate regional totals based on data from all respondents – no attempt has been made to estimate for non-respondents and missing data.

Regions are presented in the same order throughout – i.e. North East, North West, Yorkshire & the Humber, East Midlands, West Midlands, East of England, South East, and South West. Data for London are included in the main report, as are the totals for England.
