

Section 4 Schools library services

Introduction and contextual information

The questionnaire was distributed electronically to 144 authorities believed to operate schools library services in the UK, in May 2006. This was two fewer than last year, and the overall response rate was slightly lower, at 86%. All English counties and ELBs in Northern Ireland completed returns this year (*Table 4a*). The response from the North West of England was reduced following a decision by the SCL in the region to complete only those statistical returns which have a statutory basis. The responding SLSs cover 92% of LEA pupils in England and in the whole of the UK. Respondents were again given the option of printing the form if they preferred; 91% of returns were made electronically, compared to 85% last year.

There were nine London boroughs, seven metropolitan districts, six unitary authorities, one county, four Welsh authorities and three authorities in Scotland which had no form of schools library service provision at the start of the year (*see Appendix A*). The service in **South Tyneside** closed in April 2006, and was unable to provide data for the survey. **Belfast ELB** and **South Eastern ELB** became a shared service known as BASE in January 2006, but have provided separate returns. **Renfrewshire** Education Resource Service closed on 31 March 2006, but noted that *from 1 April 2006 Renfrewshire Libraries have assumed responsibility for the Education collection. All other materials have been re-allocated. Secondary Schools will continue to receive professional support and advice.* **Carmarthenshire** commented *not enough money spent on the SLS, despite this being one of the few counties with 100% take-up from the schools.*

On a positive note, the London borough of **Ealing** has entered into a new agreement with **Berkshire** Education Library Service to provide services to its schools. The service in **Doncaster** has come through major disruption during the year - *In late January 2006 we had a major fire at the S.L.S. The work room, meeting room and librarian's work area were totally destroyed. Over 8,000 books were lost in the fire and some 60,000 books had to be sent away for cleaning due to smoke damage. Services to schools had to be suspended. Although we are still awaiting a rebuild of the fire damaged areas, we had the service back up and running just after Easter 2006, this included all projects requested for Summer Term 2006 being delivered only a week behind schedule.*

Provision of service

Schools library services are provided by the same authorities as provide public library services throughout the UK. In Northern Ireland, these are the Education & Library Boards, and this is the only area where there is a statutory basis for the service. There are a number of formal co-operative arrangements in place, and a total of 17 services in England, and two in Wales, reported serving schools in other LEA areas by formal agreement. Some of the non-responding authorities are also believed to have such arrangements in place. Details are given under “partner authorities” in Table 4.1.

A number of services also serve schools from outside their main area on an ad hoc basis, for a fee. This is shown in Table 4.1 in the “others served” column, listing other authorities in which any schools were served in 2005-06. A total of 38 services – 35 of them in England – reported serving schools outside their main area of operations. All schools in **Knowsley** are offered a SLA and currently receive a budget from the LEA. Schools in Liverpool are informed about the service in a joint agreement with Liverpool City Council but do not receive funding and take up is usually approx 12 schools per year.

Table 4.1 also summarises the types of school to which services are offered. All schools library services in the UK serve primary schools, 98% serve special schools, 94% serve nursery schools, 94% serve secondary schools, 83% serve pupil referral units, and 59% serve pre-school groups. 68% serve schools in the independent sector, and 39 authorities reported offering services to other, non-school, institutions. Details are given in Table 4.4.

Administration

Table 4.1 gives details of the types of service offered, management structure and main source of funding for schools library services in the UK. The position is summarised in Table 4b; funding and expenditure are considered in detail in Tables 4.11 to 4.17 (pages 260-293).

Following the rapid changes of recent years, the funding position in general appears to have stabilised. The majority of services in England are funded wholly or primarily directly from schools, whilst in the rest of the UK funding is largely provided centrally.

A number of comments were made on management structures, and funding arrangements. In **Islington**, all school services are provided by a private company. **Surrey** School Support Service (Four-S) is a joint venture between the County Council and VT Education Group plc, which is contracted to provide education advisory and support services for local authority schools. In **Aberdeen**, the service is managed by a *generic cross-departmental unit in LEA neighbourhood services North*.

In **Havering**, the schools library service is run as an independent business unit, with the public library providing a contribution to the cost of accommodation and some overheads. In **North Tyneside**, there is no budget allocation from the LEA, with the library funding the stock, staff and building, and limited income generation.

In Wandsworth, budgets are *part delegated, part centrally funded but the service does not fit the traditional model and has a wide brief*. **Barnet**, too, has *an element of central funding in the budget, and the library service is now within the education department*. Other services retaining an element of central funding include **Birmingham, Sandwell, Southampton, Dorset, Gloucestershire, Norfolk** and **Suffolk** – this is discussed further below, and details for individual services are given in Table 4.15.

In **North Ayrshire**, the service is now integrated with the public library service which is within Educational Services. However, *due to the high profile of the Education Resource service it is still funded separately with its own budget and financial accountability*. **Powys** also noted that the service is *very integrated with the public library service*.

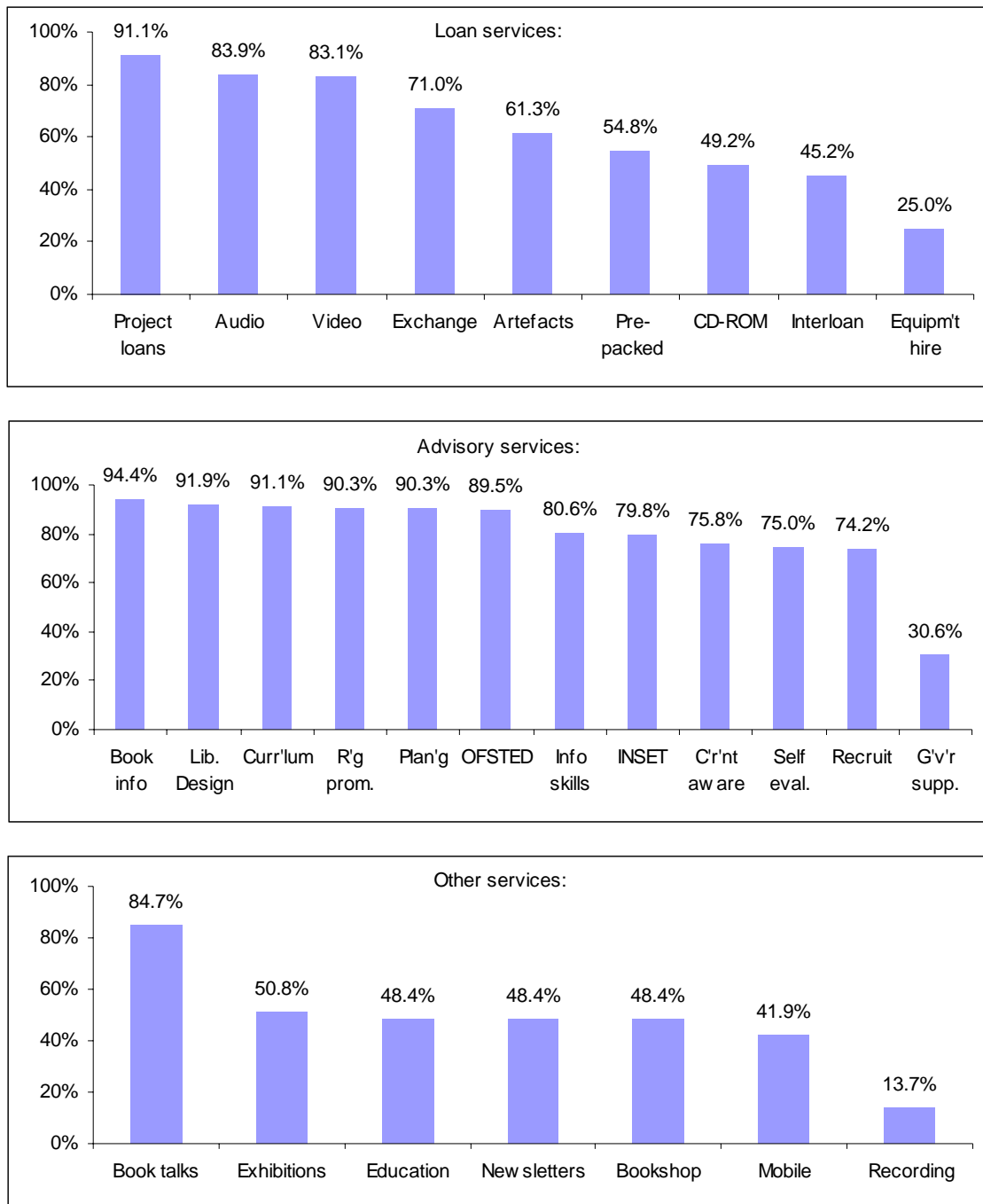
Services provided

Table 4.2 gives details of the services offered as part of the ‘standard package’, and what is available as a ‘stand alone’ element or at extra cost. There is increasing interest in benchmarking between schools library services, and the information in this table should be essential reading for anyone embarking on such an exercise. It is important to note that no two schools library services in the UK offer exactly the same combination of services to schools, whether as part of the standard service, or for additional payment. It is, however, possible to find services with sufficient similarities to conduct benchmarking exercises, but the selection must be made with care, and the exercise may need to be restricted to certain elements of the service, or different partners chosen for different elements.

There is no service listed in the LISU return which is offered by all schools library services (*Fig 4c*). Over the UK as a whole, the most commonly available services are: book and resource advice, available from 94% of the 124 respondents; advice on design and refurbishment of school libraries, from 92%; and project loans available from 91% of services. The least frequently offered are equipment hire, available from 25%, and recording services, from 14% of schools library services. Services were again asked whether they offered training and support for school Governors; 36 in England, and two in Wales did so.

Relatively few “other” services were described this year, with just 31 services (25%) reporting items. Details, where provided, are given in the notes to Table 4.2. It is likely that some of these could be amalgamated into the existing list. Others are more innovative, for example, PLIP in **Tower Hamlets** - *Professional Librarians in Primary Schools*, a service where we “hire” out librarians for a day or half a day to primary schools. Eight schools used the service in 2005-06.

There were a large number of comments expanding on the responses to these questions, further emphasising the diversity of provision available: Also in **Tower Hamlets**, the Humanities Education Centre *works with a wide range of agencies to promote the global dimension in the curriculum*. **Cumbria** reported a number of new services: *healthy schools project: reading group support: foundation stage collections now serving non maintained settings as well as schools*. **Enfield** has set up an early years service, *to loan pre-packed collections of Foundation Stage curriculum items to pre-schools and playgroups. The service was set up with funding from the EYDCP and mainstreams a bulk loan service that was provided in the Sure Start area only*. In **Bolton**, early years settings are *entitled to personal tickets enabling them to borrow up to 12 book items and six museum artefacts at any one time*.

In **Gateshead**, schools receive *a free entitlement of resources and time but can and do also buy in extra*. **Northumberland** offer a *special package which is made up of a pre-determined number of resources, advisory time or mobile visits* as well as the standard service. All advisory services are *available at a charge to schools without service agreements*. **Wiltshire** noted that their basic subscription *buys each school one half-day's advisory visit, to be used as necessary*. Additional services are charged at an hourly rate.

Harrow maintains *an in-print Exhibition Collection of books to assist teachers with book purchase*. In **Cheshire**, the education collection is *reference only, but includes curriculum documents and booklists to support QCA etc*. **Shropshire** no longer offers a purchase scheme *but regularly set up supplier visits and accompany teaching staff*. **Lancashire** includes CD-ROM *as part of project loans*. **Southern ELB** offer a recording service on behalf of all the Northern Ireland Boards. **Western ELB** noted that a *restricted budget within the Education authority has reduced funding for INSET courses*.

Staff time spent on advisory services

Table 4.2 also gives information on the estimated proportion of professional staff time spent on advisory services. In many services this is estimated, and ranges from nil in **Lincolnshire** and 2% in **Merton**, which is *mainly a project loan service*, **Sutton** and **Rhondda Cynon Taff**, to 80% in **Walsall, Hampshire** and **Redcar & Cleveland** and 90% in **Kent**. On average, 38% of professional staff time is spent on advisory services – equivalent to almost two days per week and little changed from last year.

Birmingham noted that their figures were estimated based on an academic year. **Devon** were able to provide a precise figure calculated from the time spent by professional staff in schools. **Wiltshire** noted that their figure represented *30% of one F/T professional librarian*. In **Plymouth**, advisory work is *performed by all staff in various capacities and therefore not measured*.

In **Wandsworth**, advice is on demand, and *unlimited support given until the project is finished*. *Approximately 15-20% of schools pa request in-school advice and support*. In **Camden**, *premium schools are entitled to up to 15 visits in one academic year*, compared to one visit per term for standard subscribers. There are *currently three premium schools using the advisory service*. In **Havering**, the *low number of FTE posts and the necessity of training a new member of staff has meant advisory work has been reactive rather than proactive*.

The advisory service in **Surrey** is available to all schools, and the libraries' consultant works *cross-phase with funding via the Service Delivery Agreement*. *Support is often targeted to need*. *In addition head teachers can purchase additional support and services*.

Collaboration, outreach and other activities

A new question last year sought details of working with extended schools, children's centres and designated specialist schools. Details are given in Table 4.3, and summarised in Table 4d. Only around three-quarters of respondents answered this question, and there seemed to be some confusion concerning the different institutions included. A number of services outside England commented that these types of institution were not relevant to them:

- *Extended schools – don't know what this is (Aberdeen)*

- Assumed that an extended school is equivalent to an ICS (Integrated Community School) (East Renfrewshire)
- Extended and specialist schools have only recently been announced in N Ireland (Western)

Harrow have written a service level agreement for Children's Centres. Hertfordshire note that Children's centres are using SLS packages and public library support, with extended schools purchasing books through SLS. **Lancashire** has promoted its service to all extended schools' project managers, but has not been commissioned to deliver services. Similarly for children's centres – promoted to all 30 managers, but no take-up of services.

The survey also sought to discover the extent of SLS work with agencies outwith the local authority, and any other activities undertaken. Based on last year's survey, a number of the most common projects and collaborative organisations were listed in the questionnaire. Table 4.3 (new this year) shows which services have taken part in such activity; and details of collaborations undertaken (where supplied) are given in Appendix C.

The most common project mentioned was involvement with various book awards, by 60% of respondents. The least common was Young Cultural Creators, ticked by just five services. **Haringey** noted that they had taken part in the pilot of the revised questionnaire for SLSPLUS. **St Helens** send out an Annual Questionnaire to schools.

Population and schools served

Pupils

A number of services commented on the difficulty of providing pupil numbers. LISU will continue to collect the available figures while the proportion of pupils served remains one of ASCEL's recommended performance indicators. Baseline population data are now available from the DfES and its parallel organisations in the home countries, although it will continue to be necessary to collect data on pupils and schools served from each individual schools library service. The reliability and consistency of these data appear to be improving.

Islington reported a continuing decline in primary school rolls, while **Milton Keynes** noted that a change in transfer has resulted in more pupils in secondary schools than last year.

Northumberland reported two school closures during the year 2005-06. The number of pupils in **Edinburgh** is dropping and it is *expected that they will continue to do so over the next decade, this will have an impact on the number of schools and classes and therefore the number of loans*. A review of school provision is currently under way in **Bedfordshire**. The present three tier system (lower, middle, upper) may be changed to primary and secondary schools.

Dorset's figures for those supported by the SLS refer to both those schools with service level agreements and those using the service *in an ad hoc way for support, resources, advice or training*. **East Dunbartonshire** note that *all pupils may access provision; there is no means of determining how many do so*.

In England and Wales, the numbers of pupils using schools library services may be considerably less than the total pupils in the authority. Table 4.4 gives details of numbers of pupils by type of school, and the percentage served. The proportion of pupils served in each type of school is recommended as a performance measure by ASCEL. Appendix A shows the total number of LEA pupils in each area, the number served by the schools library service, and the number of non LEA pupils served. Throughout this section of the report, wherever per capita figures are shown for purposes of comparison, they are based on the total number of pupils served. This gives a much more equitable picture of service provision and use than just the total number of LEA pupils in the authority.

In order to give some indication of the penetration of schools library services, Table 4e gives the total number of LEA pupils by sector, taken from relevant government sources. It also gives an estimate of the percentage of LEA pupils served, and the total numbers of non-LEA pupils served in 2005-06.

For the UK as a whole, the estimated percentage of LEA pupils served has remained unchanged, at 65% this year, despite the closure of two services. Overall, in 2004-05, 13% of LEA pupils were in schools where no schools library services were offered, either for the authority as a whole, or for that type of school. Thus 22% of pupils were in schools which did not take advantage of the services available.

An estimated 83,500 pupils from non-LEA schools, or schools outwith the designated service area, were reported to be served this year by 45 services. No attempt has been

made to estimate where figures were not provided. This is the first year for some time that the number reported has fallen; however, the number of services giving figures has also fallen this year. It is clear that many SLSs are actively marketing their services outside their traditional client base.

Schools

Table 4.5 shows details of the numbers of schools in each authority and the percentage served by the schools library service. The aim of this table is to give an indication of the take up rate of schools library services, not the breadth of coverage. Separate figures are given for the percentages of schools receiving any service, with specific details for loans and advisory services. These percentages are among the performance indicators required by OFSTED, and are summarised in Table 4f.

Whilst the majority of schools library services offer a service to all schools in their area, some exclude independent schools; some only cater for primary schools, and others offer only limited services at secondary level. **Camden** do not offer their service to secondary schools, but *should a secondary school approach us and we can provide a service to them, it will be on a pay as you use basis*. They have established a secondary school librarians group to act as a channel for support. In **Lancashire**, *secondary short stay schools have funding fully delegated but they have elected to buy back SLS service package*. In some cases, services in the independent sector are restricted to special schools with which the LEA has a relationship, e.g. **Edinburgh**. In others, premium rates are charged, or charges made where there are none for LEA schools, e.g. **Aberdeen**.

Southampton has *two special schools that are in the process of amalgamating with larger schools - they have not bought back this year in anticipation of moving premises etc. The schools they will join are subscribing schools*. They also have *one infant school of 110 pupils that does not subscribe*. **Devon**'s figures include *subscribing schools only - not the 7 schools which use on a pay-as-you-use basis*, while the figures given for use of the advisory service are for *on-site visits only (excluding the mobile library visits, advice received in centres, etc) since all subscribing schools have access to advice and practical help*. **Lancashire** recorded that *12 nursery schools elected not to purchase SLS services when the funding was delegated*, while **Carmarthenshire** note that they have *100% take-up of the service - Primary, Secondary, Playgroups, Nurseries, Special Schools - all use this service*. **North East Wales** achieve a 98% buy-back rate in the LEA where the budget is delegated.

Cheshire serve only those nurseries which are *funded and run by the Education Department*. **West Sussex** only serve four nursery schools, plus LEA nursery classes; they do not serve private nursery settings.

No attempt has been made in Table 4f to estimate the position in non-responding services. Authorities which do not offer services to a particular phase of school are not included in the calculations for that phase. Overall, 80% of schools used schools library services in 2005-06 unchanged from last year. Figures are not reproduced for independent schools, as many respondents could not supply figures for the total number of independent schools in their area. Table 4.5 gives details of the number of services included in each figure.

This year, 34 authorities reported serving a total of 676 non-school institutions. They can be broadly categorised as: FE colleges and teacher training (10 services); playgroups and other pre-school centres (7); other council departments and education support services (15); hospitals and residential care (3); home tuition (10); children's centres and special projects (8); and a variety of youth and community clubs and groups (3). **Southampton** provide some stock to *Children's Homes & other "Educational Units" within Social Services*. In **Northumberland**, *support services to Education include the advisory service, schools psychological service, service to hearing impaired children, those with communication needs, & other similar groups*. In **East Ayrshire**, the service is offered to *18 partner pre-school groups, of which four use the loan service*. In Suffolk, *services to PRUs, Home tutors and Hospital Tutors are centrally funded*. **East Lothian** noted that *many pre-school institutions receive a service from their local branch library*.

Stock and its use

Table 4.6 gives details of total schools library service stock at 31 March 2006, acquisitions during the year, and the total number of loans. Per capita figures are based on the total number of pupils served, where provided. The replenishment rate is also shown, and totals for each sector are given.

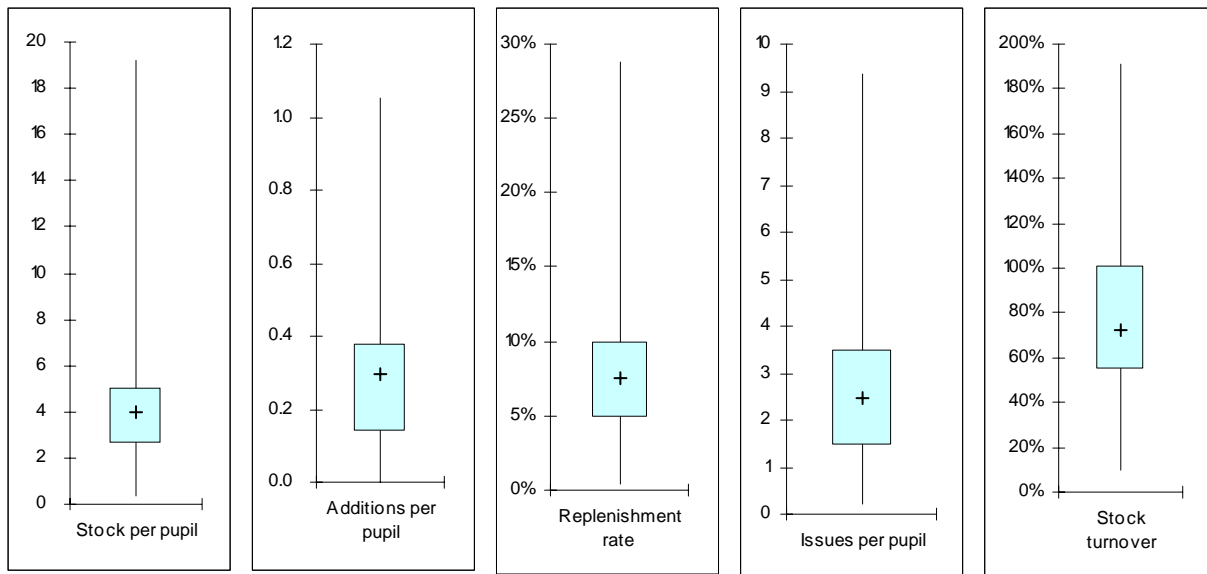
Fig 4g Range of stock ratios, all stock, whole UK

In the UK as a whole, schools library services stock an average of 4.0 items per pupil served, slightly below last year's figure of 4.1. This average conceals a wide variation, although just seven (out of 79) services reported having stock of less than one item per pupil (compared to eight last year), and four having more than ten. Acquisitions have fallen overall, however, with an average of 0.30 per pupil, or 7% of total stock across the UK as a whole. 2.5 items per pupil were issued during the year, representing a stock usage rate of 72%. This may seem relatively low compared to other library sectors; note that it does not include use within the school. The range of provision and use is illustrated in Fig 4g.

Table 4.7 gives information concerning project loans issued by type of school, and Table 4.8 details of the use of extended loans. The diverse nature of loan services to schools clearly makes comparison between different schools library services extremely hazardous. It is hoped that the separation of usage data on two key components of the service will aid interpretation. These figures are included in the list of recommended performance measures.

Data for project loans were available from 87 services (62%), and 72% of these could break them down by type of school, at least in part. The figures per pupil given in Table 4.7 for each school phase are based on the number of pupils served in that phase. Within the state sector, pupils in special schools fare best, with an average of 3.0 loans per pupil, while secondary schools receive least, just 0.2. This reflects the emphasis of loan services in many areas on primary and lower secondary materials.

Twenty-six services reported that the majority of their loans had been recalled at 31st March, due to the end of term. The comment from **Angus** was typical: *the majority of loans from the previous term had been returned by 31st March and most new loans were not yet issued*. For **Bristol**, *31 March was the last day of term so, although not in the school holidays, all project loans and many deposit collections had been collected*, while in **Bolton**, 55% of project loans had been returned by 31st March.

Extended loans are offered less frequently than project loans, and Table 4.8 lists only those SLSs believed to offer this service (71% of the total). Only 55% of these – 59 services – were able to supply any information at all. This has all been presented in Table 4.8, but totals and averages should be used with care, due to the relative lack of data. Based on all available data, there were an average of 1.7 items on loan per pupil in schools at 31 March 2006. One item was exchanged per pupil during the year, giving an 'exchange rate' of 60%.

Comments from individual services

Several services commented that their figures, particularly for issues, were not broken down in such a way as to complete the detail required. **Islington**, for example, *do not separate out*

independent and others in their record keeping. Buckinghamshire are no longer able to easily differentiate between the categories in their issue statistics. Northumberland do not keep a breakdown of issue figures. Wiltshire are unable to split figures between different types of school, and Western ELB are unable to obtain accurate data about this area from their LMS. East Lothian noted that their figure for bulk loans includes all non fiction and fiction exchanged to schools. It has not been broken down between primary and secondary schools or the special schools. Cornwall noted that they could not provide details of total stock as our deposit collection figures are not reliable enough. In Essex, because the records show "permanent loans" as well, they cannot easily disaggregate the figures, and noted that these figures must be somewhat inaccurate as they go back to 1980s and much of that stock will have been lost. East Riding of Yorkshire provided estimated figures for stock totals and issues, but reported that they now have an IT system and once cataloguing/issuing is complete it will be possible to give more precise figures

Others noted that particular problems with computer systems had contributed to a lack of accurate data: Somerset have the raw data available to answer all the questions, but their computer system provides *poor statistical and management information*, and staff time to analyse the data is limited. Coventry have no figures for additions to stock or on loan as at 31/03/06 because of reported problems with Talis, and Herefordshire also had *continuing problems with Talis during the first quarter* which made it difficult to produce accurate issue figures. Walsall noted *computer problems may have affected* their totals for loans, while in Plymouth, *due to technical problems with our library management system we are unable to extract a reliable figure for stock count purposes.*

Havering noted a *27% increase in the number of projects provided* this year, while in Edinburgh *the number of items issued appears to have gone down over the last year, however this discrepancy is due to the number of items in boxed collections being reduced, so the number of collections lent has actually gone up.* Stockport reported that they *have extended loans in schools, delivered via the mobile library. These are long term deposit collections - unless a school decides not to buy into SLS these books remain in the school library. This amount not showing in these stats e.g. 2005/6 issued 15,290 books to schools. If school opts out these books borrowed over 10 years are returned to SLS or school may choose to purchase the stock from SLS.* In Bolton, many project loans for summer term are *issued in previous year. Teachers can borrow 12 book items and museum artefacts on personal tickets. Total number of items borrowed on personal tickets - 12,272.* In addition to project loans, Gateshead *issue books to support reader development sessions with schools - this is for varying lengths of time and throughout the year. The total number of issues for books in this category is 17,730*

Estimates of total stock

Table 4h gives estimated figures for the total schools library service stock and issues. Estimates have been included for those services not supplying data based on the average ratios per pupil served.

Over the UK as a whole, there were estimated to be just under 20 million items of stock, equivalent to 3.5 per pupil served. This is similar to last year's figures of 3.4 items per pupil. The rate of acquisitions has increased slightly, to 8.2 %, with over one and a half million items being added to stock during the year. Issues have fallen slightly, to 13.4 million, equivalent to 2.4 per pupil served, unchanged from last year. Longer-term trends are considered in Section 1.

Service quality

Service quality covers a broad range of measures, both qualitative and quantitative. Three of those suggested as performance measures by ASCEL – the proportion of staff time spent on advisory services, the proportion of stock replaced during the year, and the proportion of deposit stock items on loan exchanged – have been discussed above. Those relating to staff quality were covered in Section 2 (pages 17-20). Tables 4.9 and 4.10 deal with two remaining quality measures – the speed of response of loan delivery services, and the application of ICT.

Loan delivery services

SLSs providing loan delivery services were asked to indicate the number of deliveries to be made at the start of the term, and the number of these which were delivered within five and ten working days. This question continues to prove problematic for some services, and some interpretation has been necessary. Data from services that had clearly misunderstood the question have not been included in Table 4.9 (pages 250-254). The overall picture, based on data from 84 services, shows 75% of deliveries required at the start of term being made within five working days, and 100% within ten. Performance is rather better for deliveries at other times, with 98% being made within five working days of the request, and 100% within ten.

Camden's Service Level Agreement states that topic boxes will be delivered within 15 working days from receipt of a request or from the first day of term should requests be received during the school holidays, and self-selected topics within five working days. In **Merton**, the Service Level Agreement states that delivery should be within ten working days from the start of the school term. **Norfolk's** Service Commitment is that all projects ordered before start of term will be delivered by first termly LEA courier run. Performance targets for **North Eastern ELB** are for 85% to be processed within 5 working days and 95% delivered within three weeks. **Angus** undertake to deliver all project requests received before the end of the previous term within the first two weeks of the beginning of the next term or outwith this period within five days of receiving them, but *can usually exceed this standard*. Reading and artefact collections are delivered outwith peak project request periods.

In **Tower Hamlets**, a lot of teachers select their own and take their box away with them, and they do not count how many are taken away and how many are delivered. Their service

level agreement is to deliver within seven working days of receiving a request, *which we achieve*. **Northumberland**'s figures include collections picked up by teachers who expressed a preference for doing this rather than a) opt for the Delivery/Collection van service offered as part of their Service Agreement, or b) ask to have their projects delivered to their nearest public library.

West Sussex' project loans are *despatched via the public library courier system. Schools / teachers collect loans from their chosen library. 85% are sent out before the beginning of the respective term, with 12% done within 5-10 working days of start of term, dependent upon when request comes in and the remainder supplied within above timescale within the term.* **South Eastern ELB** also utilise the branch library network, with most deliveries *via the branch library closest to the school. However, we do deliver direct to schools when possible and dependant on volume of material to be delivered*, and are currently looking at their delivery system.

Sheffield operate a system for delivery at beginning of each term, over a two-week period. Deadline dates for project requests are set, and all requests are fulfilled by van delivery date. Separate requests for personal collection are made available within 48 hours. All deliveries in **Leeds** are now at the beginning of terms. Most schools pre-request for the whole school year. **Cheshire** has a fortnightly delivery schedule and *hope to deliver within this period*. At the start of term, if schools get requests in by the given time, they aim to deliver within first delivery of term. In **Northamptonshire**, deliveries are made within the first eight days of term. In **East Ayrshire**, deliveries to schools are made once a term, to a specific timetable. Schools in **Perth & Kinross** request their collections in June before school holidays, and are supplied during first week of each term, *except where schools are late putting in requests, or are on a loan stop due to high level of non-returned items*.

NE Wales' data for collections delivered includes individual items (e.g. videos, Art Prints, Artefacts Boxes, Big Books, Group Readers etc) as well as Project Collections, of which there were 8,711. They do not have a breakdown of the figures between beginning of term and the rest of the year, but achieve 100% of deliveries within ten days of beginning of term where the request has been made by the advertised deadline.

In **Wandsworth**, *topic requests can be submitted at any time during the year with 99% compiled and delivered within 4 working days. Schools can receive deliveries via internal courier service every other day.* In **Buckinghamshire** *extended loans are delivered as and when during the year, not just at the start of a term, some schools will make more than one visit to choose new stock. We ask primary schools to request projects a minimum of 6 weeks before the start of term, where this notice is given, approximately 75% were delivered within 5 working days and 100% within the 10 working days.* Carmarthenshire deliver loans *as and when staff available*.

Essex are *starting a tracker system* to try to capture delivery performance information. **North Lanarkshire** only gather *basic information on miles completed and uplifts/deliveries completed throughout the year*. Two services which do not operate van delivery services commented on their procedure: **Shropshire** estimate that *75% are ready within 5 days and 95% within 10 days* – teachers can *visit the SLS at any time, without prior booking, to select resources (term time and school holidays)*. In **Highland**, *loans are either collected in person or posted out when ready*.

Application of ICT

Two broad areas are covered here – ICT within the service, and support for ICT within school libraries. Details are given in Table 4.10. There has been a further increase in the proportion of services using a library management system, to 90%.

Havering noted that their system has been further delayed, to 2006-07; **Sunderland** is also due to install a system in 2006-07. **Portsmouth** installed Eclipse Professional in November 2004. **Pembrokeshire** also use this system, and are in the process of entering all their stock – *currently all non-fiction is on and being issued. Welsh and junior fiction are the next categories to catalogue.* **East Dunbartonshire** use Alice. **Shropshire**'s system is being phased in, from February 2006, and **Leeds** are currently adding stock to their system. **Scottish Borders** noted that *three high schools have an automated management system, with planned initiation of Dynix in the remaining six high schools.* **Southampton** use their automated system for short term loans only, and **Devon** use theirs for the *Book Exhibition collection only at present but actively pursuing funding for SLS computerisation project.* **Orkney** reported that the public library has an automated library service, but the school resource centre does not.

Throughout the UK as a whole, 42% of services have a catalogue which can be accessed remotely, compared to 32% last year, and 45% allow schools to book resources electronically. In **Orkney**, the public library has its own website and the SRC catalogue may be accessed remotely from the home page. 77% offer management system support to schools, with some charging extra for this service – **Southampton** include some support for library management systems in their SLA, *but training & installation of systems is charged.*

Only 21 services, 17%, reported having their own websites, although many more – 76% – had pages within a wider local authority site.

Several services reported having websites or pages under development, including **Havering**, which anticipates its own website on the London Grid for Learning (LGfL) in 2006-07, **Kingston upon Hull** which plans its own site for 2006-07, **Lancashire, Wiltshire** and **North Lanarkshire**. **Bedfordshire** launched a website in October 2005. **Essex** hoped to have their own website by end of December 2005 *but now held up by County Council examining all IT provision.*

Redbridge is part of the LGfL. **Hertfordshire** has links to *HertsDirect (HCC Website) and National Grid for Learning*, while **Kent** has one page on the main Kent County Council website and several pages on their extranet (www.clusterweb.org.uk/schoollibraries). **Stirling** has a page on the local authority intranet. In **North Ayrshire**, the online website is *used by many Scottish local authorities and by teachers across the UK; it was deemed to be an example of "excellent practice" by HMIE.*

Expenditure

Table 4.11 (*pages 260-264*) shows total schools library service expenditure on staff, premises, materials and other expenses, in total and per pupil served. The proportion of total expenditure in each category is also given. The detail of this table gives important contextual information when making comparisons of services, as the degree to which individual services are accountable for their staff, premises and other costs varies considerably. Tables 4.12 and 4.13 (*pages 265-276*) show the trends in total expenditure per capita and materials expenditure per capita over the last ten years.

Authorities were again given the option of keeping their financial figures confidential; 40 requested this option this year. Their data have been included in the sector totals where this would not breach confidentiality, and percentage breakdowns given.

A number of comments were made on the expenditure data. In **Camden**, expenditure was to be *only of an emergency nature* at the end of the last financial year hence the underspend. Expenditure in **Kingston upon Hull** did not equal income this year *due to a move to premises with higher costs than previous accommodation, plus an unusually high expenditure on superannuation, which is expected to be a one-off*. **Northumberland** SLS has been able to roll over a proportion of its budget from one year to the next, while in Bolton figures were not available due to *budget realignment*.

Three authorities commented on the difficulties of supplying expenditure data in integrated services: in **Hounslow**, SLS staff work closely with colleagues in the public library children's service and share premises; *there is no requirement to keep SLS costs separate*. The service in **Dumfries & Galloway** is so *closely integrated with the public service, including shared premises, some stock and personnel, that it is difficult to give a true breakdown of costs*. In **West Lothian**, the schools service is *totally integrated into the public library service, therefore any costs are borne by that service, including premises, stationery, computer costs, transport, etc.*

Total UK estimates

Sector expenditure totals and per capita averages based on those authorities supplying data are given with each table. Table 4i gives an estimate of the total expenditure of schools library services, grossed up to allow for those authorities with missing data.

Estimates have been made for each service with incomplete data under the four separate heads according to the estimated number of pupils served and the average sector per capita figures for those authorities with data. Since the proportion of missing data varies between heads of expenditure and between sectors, the per capita figures and percentage distributions in Table 4i are not the same as those at the bottom of Table 4.11.

In the UK as a whole, £21.7m is estimated to have been spent on staff, £3.1m on premises, £10.8m on materials, and £3.6m on other expenditure in 2005-06. This is a total of £6.69 per pupil served, compared to £6.64 last year. Spending per pupil has increased in all areas this year, except materials, which has fallen from £1.98 per pupil last year. Longer term trends are considered in Section 1.

Expenditure on staff

The figures on staff expenditure should be read in conjunction with the figures on staff numbers given in Table 2.3 (*pages 34-39*). Staff expenditure is highest in London and Northern Ireland, at £5.45 and £4.62 per pupil respectively. The range is wide, with a number of services effectively making zero returns, since the service is so closely integrated with the public library service that no figure can be separated out. At the other extreme, 14 services spent more than £6 per pupil on staff, four of them more than £10.

The relative balance between staff and materials expenditure will reflect the relative importance of advisory and lending services within the authority. Scotland spends the largest proportion of the total budget on staff, at 73% on average, reflecting the greater relative importance placed on advisory services there. The English counties have the lowest average proportion, at 51%. Again there is wide variation, with 11 services (six of them in Scotland) spending more than 80% of their total on staff.

Materials expenditure

The proportion of the total budget which is spent on materials continues to fall, to 28% this year, compared to 30% last year and 32% the year before. The overall estimated total is £10.8m, compared to last year's figure of £12.1m, and equivalent to an estimated £1.84 per pupil served. Longer term trends in materials expenditure are considered below, and in Section 1 (*pages 4-5*).

There is wide variation between services, with seven spending less than 50p per pupil in 2005-06, compared to ten with this level of spending in 2004-05. This year, none reported spending nothing on materials. At the other extreme, five services spent more than £5 per pupil on materials, with the maximum this year being £5.96, in Cornwall.

Expenditure on premises

Twenty-seven services reported no expenditure on premises this year. In the remainder, figures ranged up to 61% of the total, and £5.85 per pupil served. The extent to which services are required to pay for their premises costs will affect their levels of overall expenditure, and should be taken into account when making comparisons of spending levels.

Other expenditure

Other expenditure is a "catch all" category, and what is included will vary between authorities. At one extreme are 14 services with no recorded "other" expenditure. In such cases overheads are borne by the "host" library authority and not accounted for separately. At the other end of the spectrum, there were eight authorities which spent more than 20% of their 2005-06 budget under this head. Such differences between authorities are largely due to accounting protocol and organisational variation rather than any inherent difference in the service supplied to schools.

Respondents were asked to specify what was included in “other” expenditure, and a total of 50 did so, of the 98 recording this expenditure. The responses are summarised in Table 4j. (The figures total more than 100% as most services included more than one area of expenditure under ‘other’.)

Trends in expenditure

Details of trends in per capita expenditure by service are shown in Tables 4.12 and 4.13 (pages 265-276) for total and materials expenditure respectively. There are a number of discontinuities in these tables arising from local government reorganisation. Whilst direct comparisons should not be made in these circumstances, pointers have been included to indicate which authorities relate to which as far as possible. All available data have been used, including authorities’ own estimates where appropriate, but no other estimates have been included.

Fig 4k Trends in total expenditure

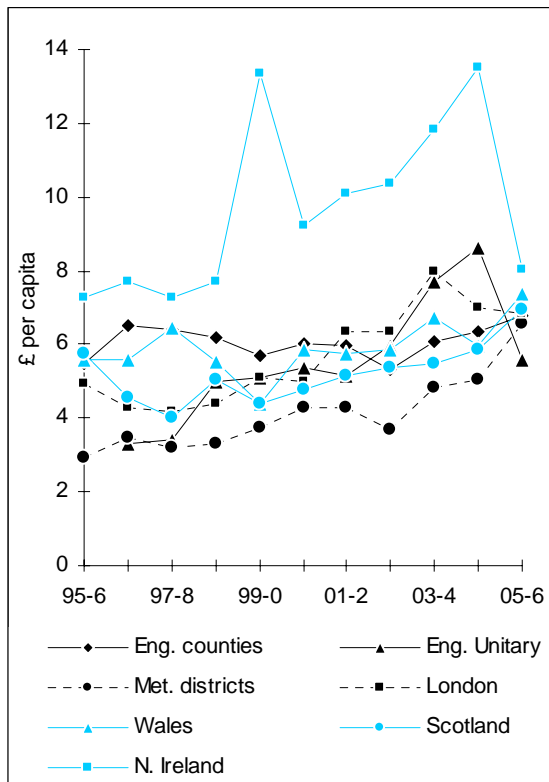
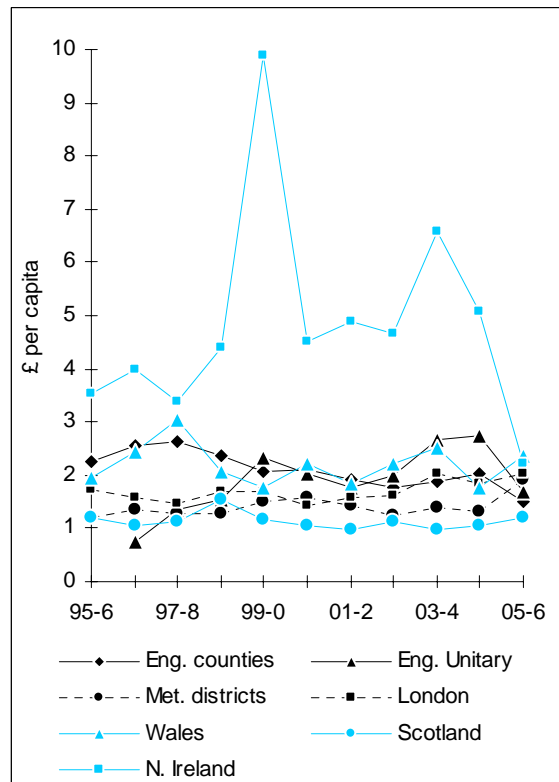


Fig 4l Trends in materials expenditure



Figs 4k and 4l illustrate trends in expenditure based on grossed-up estimates for the whole of each sector. This means that there are some discrepancies between them and the sector totals given at the foot of Tables 4.12 and 4.13. There are also some discontinuities due to local government reorganisation in the English counties. As with all sector totals, the averages conceal great differences between authorities, both in absolute levels of spending and trends. Section 1 includes an analysis of trends in expenditure taking account of inflation.

Income

Budget delegation

Table 4.14 gives details of the way in which funding for schools library services is allocated in England. This not only varies between LEAs, but may also differ by type of school. Budgets may be:

- **Fully delegated** – any nominal allocation is included in the general budget for the school, which may be spent as the school wishes
- **Devolved and earmarked** – an allocation is made to the school, with the proviso that it must be spent on schools library services
- **Centrally held** – the LEA funds the SLS directly to provide services to the designated schools

Some authorities have other arrangements, including partial delegation (e.g. **Wandsworth**), and no formal funding arrangements with the LEA (e.g. **North Tyneside**). Additional details supplied by individual services in England are given in Table 4.13. **North East Wales** reported that *the budget is delegated in one out of the four LEAs we serve and the Service is centrally funded in the other three*. In **Powys**, primary and special schools have centrally retained budgets for SLS, while secondary schools have their own budgets and their own libraries.

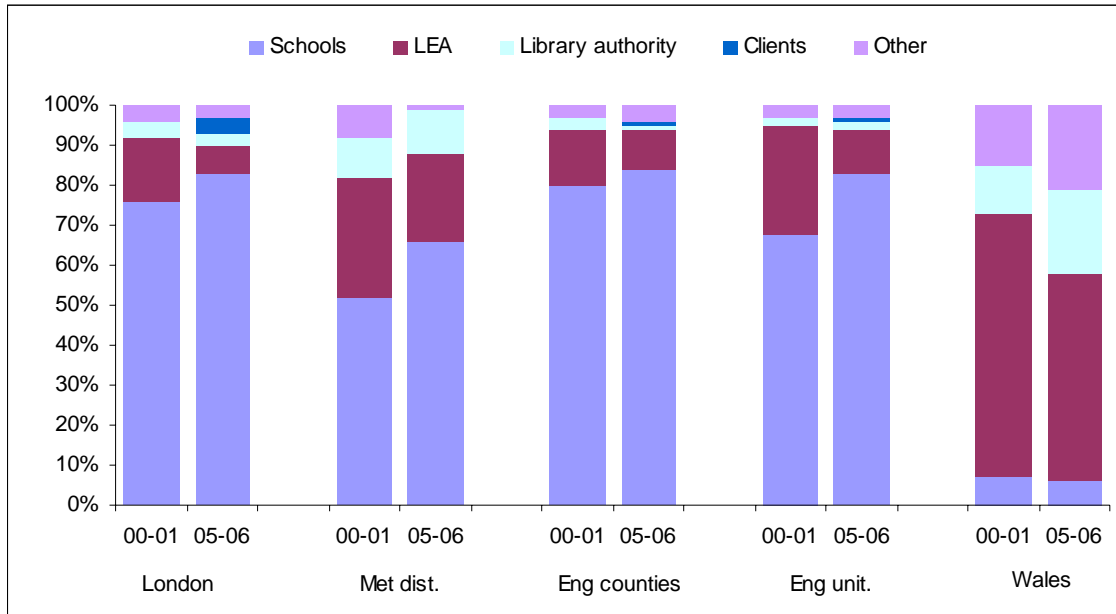
67% of services now report fully delegated budgets in nursery schools, and 65% in primary schools, compared to 66% in each last year. The proportion with fully delegated budgets in secondary and special schools remains unchanged, at 65% in special schools, and 95% in secondary schools. In 2005-06, the SLS is most likely to be centrally funded to provide services to nursery schools and special schools, but even so, only 4% of SLSs in England were in this position.

Sources of income

Table 4.15 gives details of total schools library service income and the percentage of that income deriving from each of five main sources. Services in Scotland and Northern Ireland have been included - while their services remain primarily centrally funded, with little or no earned income, the number of services in these countries with diverse income streams is increasing. Figures for 2000-01 are given for comparison purposes for England and Wales, where available. As with the expenditure figures presented above, a number of authorities requested that their figures be kept confidential; percentage breakdowns have been given and figures included in the sector totals where appropriate.

Fig 4m summarises these figures for England and Wales, showing the percentages of income derived from each source. In all sectors in England the percentage of income earned directly from schools has increased, and the proportion paid directly by the LEA has fallen. The library authority contribution has also fallen, while the contribution from other sources has grown, albeit remaining very small.

Fig 4m Percentages of income from each source, 2000-01 and 2005-06

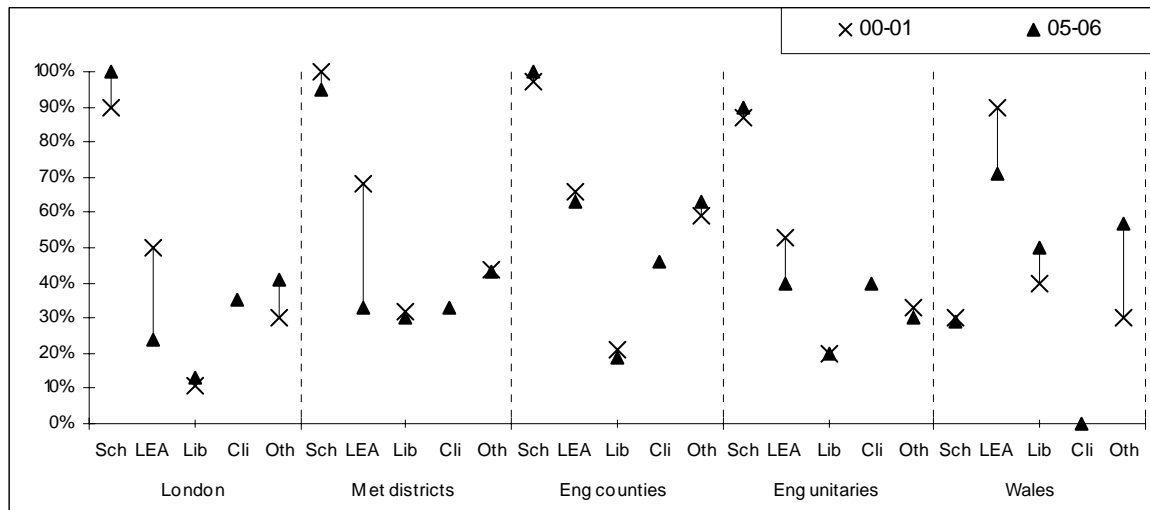


The position in Wales is rather different. Here, there has been a slight fall in the proportion of funding coming directly from schools, and a considerable fall in that from the LEA. This has been balanced by increases in the proportion of income from the library authority and from 'other' sources. There was no income from external clients in Wales in 2005-06, where the LEA remains the chief source of funding. In Scotland, more than 90% of funding is obtained centrally, from either the library authority or the LEA. In Northern Ireland, the SLS is a statutory provision, centrally funded throughout – [Western ELB](#) described the route as follows: *funding comes from the Department of Education to the Western Education & Library Board and then to the Library Service within the Board.*

Fig 4n shows the percentages of services reporting income from each source in the two years, again for England and Wales only. Within each sector these add up to far more than 100%, as few services rely on a single source of income. This clearly shows the moves towards direct funding from schools in all sectors in England, and the increasing diversity of funding sources in Wales.

In England, where diversity of funding sources is greatest, 18 of the 89 authorities (20%) giving details for 2005-06 reported receiving all their income from schools, compared to 32% last year. Two were entirely centrally funded by the LEA, compared to one last year, and the remainder all reported diverse income streams. Funding schemes appear to be stabilising in general, although services are finding new sources of income, with the proportion generating funds from non-traditional sources increasing, although the amount raised is still relatively small.

Twenty-two services gave examples of what had been included as 'other' income; this included a variety of specific charges and fees, bookshop income and other sales, sponsorship and grants for specific projects, refunds and transfers, and consultancy.

Birmingham noted that their income from the LEA has *decreased due to LEA Nurseries having delegated budgets from April 2005*. **Gloucestershire** are *allocated some money from the Local Education Authority to work with schools who have special needs with regard to literacy. These schools are identified for us and we then carry out work on their libraries in agreement with the school staff*. **Wiltshire's** LEA contribution to 'income' is *merely budgeted/unbudgeted funding of shortfall*.

The public library in **Havering** *provides and contributes to the cost of accommodation and some overheads*. Similarly, in **Bedfordshire**, the SLS is mainly self-funded by income received from schools but *the public library service covers accommodation costs and all associated overheads*. In **Dorset**, *no income is received from the Library Authority to pay for the operation of the SLS directly, but this year the SLS has undertaken several projects on behalf of the Public Library Service which have been a helpful source of income*.

Services to **Cheshire** primary and special schools *are included in the county Schools Partnership Agreement, which is managed by the Education department who invoice schools and then vire money into our budget. Warrington Borough Council organise the invoicing of Warrington primary and special schools and then send us the income*.

Angus described its position as follows: *ERS is managed by the library authority and receives an annual grant from the Education department. This year the grant was increased to cover staffing cost increases from previous years which had been previously underwritten by the library authority. Income identified as being from library authority is funding associated with the continuing small shortfall between expenditure and income. ERS also has the opportunity to bid in for additional sums from the Education Department for specific projects which vary from year to year but usually include monies for some elements of the Angus Book Award, artefact development and Inter Library Loans. This bidding is used to ensure that the core media fund is topped up. This year we were able to also access a small sum from the Scottish Executive Quality of Life budget allocated to Library services for children within Angus which covered some of ERS Angus Book Award costs. This and the bids*

allowed us to spend slightly more on materials than last year but nevertheless the materials budget is still significantly lower than a few years ago.

Charging structures

Table 4.16 gives details of the different charging structures in operation in England and Wales. Of 79 services which gave details, only two, both in Wales, make no charges directly to schools, although it seems likely that some of those not completing this question also do not charge directly. Charging structures vary considerably, with some services operating different schemes for primary and secondary schools. The most common methods are to set subscription levels based on items/services used (52%), or based on the number of pupils in the school (52%). Nineteen services reported offering packages which covered more than one year.

Many authorities made comments on their charging structures, and these have been incorporated into Table 4.16 where possible. **Bedfordshire** noted *schools are increasingly saying to us "We have ££ to spend - what can you provide for this?"*.

Some Scottish services, which do not generally charge schools directly for core services, noted income from specific activities, or types of school. Details are included with the notes to Table 4.15. **Aberdeen, Dumfries & Galloway, North Ayrshire, Orkney** and **Southern ELB** all made the point that schools were not charged for their services, although **Aberdeen** has *subscription rates available to private nurseries, individuals and schools not in our authority*, and **North Ayrshire** noted that *during the first three years of the Primary School Library Project a subscription of £600 was required, partly to fund project staff. The Educational Services Department now funds two professional staff and a library assistant to maintain and develop the project and related initiatives*.

Income from schools

Table 4.17 shows the total income earned directly from schools, and the proportions of this which are attributable to different types of schools. It includes all services in England which charge schools, plus four from the rest of the UK which gave information on their income from schools.

A total of 64 services in England provided a full breakdown of their income by type of school. Based on just those services reporting on their income, 81% was from maintained primary and nursery schools, 15% from maintained secondaries and colleges, 1% from non-maintained schools and 2% from special schools. These figures are virtually unchanged from last year.
