

# Preparing to enter the UK

#### Obtaining your visa

Unless you are a British Citizen or you already hold immigration permission that allows you to live and study in the UK, you will most likely need to obtain immigration permission before travelling to the UK to study.

The UK Visas and Immigration website <u>gov.uk/visa-</u> <u>immigration</u> gives up-to-date information on how and where to apply as well as local application procedures. You should read through the information note on Student visas <u>gov.uk/student-visa</u>

As part of your visa application you will require a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS). Information on obtaining a CAS from the University is available from <u>Iboro.ac.uk/international/visa-immigration/cas</u> You will be given a comprehensive guide to obtaining your visa once you have received your CAS. #### Names on documentation

Occasionally, problems occur with the spelling of names and addresses, especially in connection with students from countries that use a different alphabet from English. It is best to decide on how you wish your name to be spelt in English and then use this spelling at all times. Preferably, this should be the spelling that is given in your passport.





#### **Biometric Residence Permit (BRP)**

Your visa will be issued for a period of 30 days, which provides you with time to travel to the UK, and then you must collect your Biometric Residence Permit, which contains your permission to stay longer.

When you complete your visa application you will need to provide contact details in the UK and/or those of where you are studying and which Post Office you wish to collect your BRP from. You can use the University's address for this purpose, and the nearest Post Office is 26-28 The Broadway, Stratford, London, E15 4QS.

You will need to take your passport containing your visa and the letter you received when your visa was issued when you go to collect your BRP.

#### Accessing healthcare in the UK

You will be required to pay the Immigration Health Surcharge (IHS) before applying for your visa. Please check these details carefully for the surcharge required: gov.uk/healthcare-immigration-application/overview

#### Students studying for less than six months

If you wish to stay in the UK for less than six months, it may be appropriate to apply for a short-term study visa: gov.uk/study-visit-visa

#### Tuberculosis (TB) screening

TB screening is compulsory for those applying for a visa for longer than six months in certain countries. Further information can be found here: <u>gov.uk/tb-test-visa</u>

### Visiting Europe and the USA while in the UK

If you are planning to visit Europe or the USA while you are studying with us, you may find it easier to apply for an entry visa from the appropriate Embassy in your country before you travel to the UK.



# Living in London

East London is an eclectic mix of the contemporary and the retro, with characterful, historic buildings nestling beside polished new developments. Following the iconic London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games, East London has entered the spotlight as one of the most ambitious and exhilarating places in the world. Home to Loughborough University London, the area is a hub for the creative, new media and digital industries and is a magnet for bold, enterprising people and organisations.

It is made up of several boroughs. The fashionable areas of Shoreditch, Hoxton, Dalston and London Fields have an array of markets, galleries and pop-up stores and are a hub for start-up businesses. It is also worth visiting Broadway Market in Hackney which has been operating since 1890.

Brick Lane, near to Liverpool Street station, is a cultural melting pot. It is home to a large Bangladeshi community and has numerous Asian grocery stores and restaurants. For a bustling business and entertainment district, visit Canary Wharf which offers film, music, theatre, dance, art and fashion, and over 300 shops, bars and restaurants. From Stratford, take the Jubilee line to Canary Wharf (approximately a total journey time of 20 minutes).

Right next to East London lies the City of London, also known as the Square Mile. The world's leading financial and business centre, it is the oldest part of London and hosts historic attractions such as the Tower of London, built in the 11th century, and St Paul's Cathedral.

From Stratford, take the Central line to St Paul's Cathedral (approximately a total journey time of 20 minutes).

Westfield Stratford City is Europe's largest urban shopping centre and is within a 15 minute walk from the campus. The centre boasts over 250 retailers as well as a growing range of cafes, bars and restaurants. The complex also boasts a 20-screen cinema and a futuristic bowling alley.

<u>Trails on the Olympic Park</u> – For a fun and free day out, follow one of the Olympic Park trails through beautiful meadows, wetlands and waterways. The Park covers 560 acres so there's plenty to explore.




### Getting to Loughborough University London

Your safety is our main priority and we want to make it as easy as possible for you to get to Loughborough University London when it is safe for you to do so.

#### Have a safe flight

London is an extremely well-connected city, offering one of the fastest and most efficient rail, bus and road networks in the world. To make sure your journey into London is as smooth as possible we have a range of advice for <u>travelling from a London airport</u>.



# Travelling across the City

There are a number of ways to travel around London, though public transport is often the fastest and easiest method of getting around the city.

#### The London Underground

The London Underground, or "the Tube", is often the key mode of transport for visitors, students and workers travelling across the city. The service normally runs from 5am until midnight, with night services operating on some lines every Friday and Saturday evening. The Tube fare varies depending on how far you travel, the time of day, and your method of payment.

#### Discounted travel for full-time students

If you're 18 or over, live at a London address during term time and you are studying a full-time programme with us, you may be eligible for an 18+ Student Oyster photocard, which offers 30% discount on travel on most rail, bus and tram services in London, including the London Underground. If you think you will travel regularly within the UK, then you may benefit from purchasing a 16-25 Railcard which entitles you to travel by rail anywhere in Britain at a 34% discount. To buy a railcard you will need to provide proof of your age (eg passport) and a passport-size photograph. Find out more visit: <u>16-25railcard.co.uk</u>

#### Travelling by coach

On arrival into the UK, many students use National Express Coaches to travel from the airport to a destination close to their accommodation. Their services operate day and night, and offer more than 100 services every 24 hours on selected routes. #### Travelling by bus

London's iconic double-decker buses are a quick, convenient and affordable way to travel around the city, with plenty of opportunities to see famous London buildings and attractions along the way. You can't pay bus fares with cash – instead you must use an Oyster card or make a contactless payment using a debit or credit card.

#### London rail services

There are a number of rail operators in operation across Greater London and beyond, including Southeastern Railway, Southern Railway, London Overground, Greater Anglia and London Midland. How much you pay depends on the time of day and which lines you use.

#### Travelling by car

Cars can be expensive to buy, insure, fuel and park, so consider whether or not you really need one, especially if you're on a budget. Whilst it is free to drive on the roads close to campus, there is a Congestion Charge for cars travelling across some areas of central London.

#### London taxis

Travelling across London by taxi can be expensive. We would recommend you travel by public transport, but if you would rather travel by taxi we suggest booking in advance.

# Things to remember

We're delighted you are joining the Loughborough family, and we want to help you settle in as quickly as possible. Before you start enjoying student life in the city, there are a few things you need to do first.

#### **Register with the University**

A few weeks before the start of term, you will be sent an email inviting you to complete Online Registration. You will be guided through a series of screens and asked to upload a photograph of yourself. It is important that you complete this process before your arrival, so that we can then produce your University ID Card and have it ready to collect during Registration.

#### Pay your fees

Fees can be paid for all programmes in one sum by the fourth week of the first term. The preferred method of fee payment is through the secure online portal which can be found on the Student Finance web page. Payment of fees can also be made by bank cheque or banker's draft, made payable to Loughborough University. We also accept payment by credit/debit cards (Visa/Mastercard/Eurocard/Switch/Delta). The University cannot accept cash. epay.lboro.ac.uk/open

#### Payment in instalments

Instead of paying your fees in one sum, you may pay them in three equal termly instalments from October to May by direct debit from a UK bank account. If you wish to pay by this method then a Direct Debit form can be downloaded from the Student Finance web page:

#### Paying through a sponsor

You should provide the University with proof of your sponsorship in advance of your arrival. The best way to do this is by sending a copy to the Admissions Office. This should be an official letter stating who your sponsor is and how much they are sponsoring you for. The full fee can be paid at the start of the academic year and, if the University has received proof of your sponsorship, your sponsor will be invoiced for your fees. If your sponsor is unable to pay your fees, you will become liable for their payment.

Statements will be sent for tuition fees (for self-funding students) to your term-time student e-mail address at the beginning of each term. There are many different ways to pay your fees. If you have been awarded a bursary or scholarship by the University, this will be deducted from your tuition fees when you are invoiced.

#### Open a UK bank account

Opening a UK bank account will enable you to pay your rent and manage other daily expenses without incurring any extra charges. If you'd like to open a UK bank account, you should aim to choose a bank before you arrive in the UK, or see if you can start applying for an account before you leave. It's a good idea to bring travellers' cheques or small amounts of cash with you to the UK in case of delays setting up your account when you get here.

All banks will ask you to verify your identity, however different banks may want to see different documents, so check their websites or give them a call to make sure you've got everything you need.

Most banks will ask to see the following:

- Your passport or ID card
- Your visa
- Proof of your UK address, such as your tenancy agreement
- Proof you're a student, such as your offer letter

#### Register with a medical centre

To find your nearest medical centre, please visit nhs.uk/service-search/find-a-GP.

If you are currently taking medication please bring one month's supply of medicine with you when you leave home. The current prescription charge in the UK is £9.65 (correct from June 2023).

#### **Register with the Police**

Certain nationalities who come to the UK for over six months will be required to register with the local police. This may be confirmed on your initial visa and/or Biometric Residence Permit (BRP) issued in the UK.

If this applies, you must register to comply with visa requirements. The Student Advice and Support Service provides information on police registration and may be contacted direct for individual advice: <u>lboro.ac.uk/police-registration</u>

#### Consider buying a UK sim card

Most students travelling to the UK from outside of Europe will be charged extra for using their existing sim card in the UK. There are two sim card options you can choose from when you arrive into the UK.

Pay As You Go (PAYG) plans allow you top up the phone with credit and use this at your convenience.

Monthly contracts are usually better value as you will get free minutes and texts but you will normally be expected to pay a monthly fee for at least 12 months from the start of the contract.

If you are likely to make regular contact with friends and family outside of the UK and Europe, it is wise to look for deals for international calls and texts.

The dialling code for the UK is +44, which replaces the '0' at the start of a number when calling UK numbers from a non-UK phone provider or network.





### Careers

Loughborough University is a top ten UK university, and has been rated 5 stars for innovation and employability by the QS Stars University Rankings. #### **Graduate Route**

In September 2019, the UK Government announced it plans to reintroduce the two-year Graduate Route visa for international students, most commonly referred to as the Post Study Work Visa. This will allow eligible students to work in the UK for two years after completing their course.

# Checklist

Before you leave home, please remember when you're packing your suitcase that you will have to carry your bags around the airports and to your accommodation building. A key rule is if you cannot carry it, do not pack it!

#### Don't forget your important documents

- ✓ Your valid passport (or recognised travel document/card)
- Entry visa certificate
- Photocopies of your UK visa and your passport's personal details page
- Unconditional offer letter from Loughborough University
- ✔ Documentary evidence of financial support for fees and maintenance
- ✓ If your fees and living expenses have been paid in advance into the University's bank account, a letter from the person who has made the transfer authorising the University to refund to you the amount allocated for your living expenses
- TB test certificate or other medical certificates, if necessary
- Enough cash/travellers cheques to support yourself until you can open a bank account in the UK
- Travel insurance documents

#### Personal items

- Clothes (don't forget a warm jumper)
- Toiletries for your first few days
- Medicines and a first-aid kit
- English dictionary
- Photos of friends and family
- National or traditional dress for formal occasions and activities
