

What to do if a student discloses an incident of Sexual Violence

Sexual Violence is any unwanted behaviour of a sexual nature.



What is my role when a student discloses?


When a student discloses to you, they will be most concerned with you listening to them and providing support. They will want to feel safe and believed.

Your role:



What steps should I take?

- Assess risk.
 If you consider the student to be in immediate danger, call emergency services on 999 and then call Security (888 internal/ 222141) if you are on campus. If not, follow steps 2-9.
- 2. Create a safe space and listen. Allow the student time and space to talk.
- 3. Discuss the student's options:



- 4. Support their decision.
- 5. Give advice about support networks. Encourage them to seek further support.
- 6. Check whether alternative accommodation is required.
- 7. Fill in the template found in the University Policy and send to Chief Operating Officer and Director of Student Services.
- 8. Follow-up with the student in writing, repeating their options regarding reporting and further support.
