Study Abroad Fees	<p>The standard Study Abroad fees for 2023 are: A\$10,600 per semester (4 units of study). A\$8,800 (3 units of study).</p>
Unit Delivery Models	<p>BLOCK MODEL ALL UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS</p> <p>Students study sequential four-week units rather than juggling multiple subjects at the same time. VU is the first institution in Australia to deliver courses using the Block model; the Block Model of teaching has already been proven internationally in progressive educational institutions in places such as Sweden, Canada and the United States.</p> <p>BLOCK MODEL - POSTGRADUATE</p> <p>Since 2021 VU postgraduate have began transitioning to Block Model. Select postgraduate courses in arts, education, health, biomedicine, sport and exercise will be taught using the four-week block; the same as our undergraduate programs.</p> <p>Postgraduate business courses and selected engineering & science courses will be taught in a eight-week block. In eight-week mode you study either two units at a time over eight weeks (full time) or one unit at a time over eight weeks (part time).</p> <p>The Full list of courses being taught in block model can be viewed here: vu.edu.au/study-at-vu/why-choose-vu/vu-block-model/vu-block-model-postgraduate-courses</p> <p>TRADITIONAL MODEL SELCT POSTGRADUATE COURSES.</p> <p>All other VU postgraduate courses will continue to be taught in the current course teaching periods (i.e. multiple units at the same time over the semester/trimester, as per the course structure), until the VU Block Model is rolled out to all courses.</p> <p>This is the standard model of delivery that most universities worldwide use: students study multiple subjects at the same time, and study each of them for an entire semester. At VU, this is usually studying three or four units.</p>



Unit Selection/
Credit Transfer

Exchange and Study Abroad students can take units from any of our colleges.

Students must select their preferred units of study as part of the Victoria Abroad online application.

A full-time load is 48 credit points. This usually equates to four units. The minimum a student may undertake is 36 credit points, as this is a requirement for an Australian student visa.

Please note:

- We advise that students select 6-8 units in case there is a timetable clash or a class is cancelled.
- Units cannot be taken from the following restricted programs: Dermal Sciences, Osteopathy, Nursing and Midwifery, Paramedicine.
- The following postgraduate units are open to Exchange and Study Abroad students but they are required to travel to Spain as a compulsory unit requirement at their own expense:
SSI7002 - Sport Facility and Event Management
SSI7003 - Global Sport Business

Units that have prerequisite units or knowledge may be selected; it is the home institution's responsibility to ensure that the student has the knowledge required to succeed. VU will not assess whether this is the case.

Insurance Requirements	<p>STUDENT VISA HOLDERS Applicants intending to apply for student visas must have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) to obtain a student visa unless their home government has a reciprocal agreement in place with the Australian Government to provide coverage for each country's citizens.</p> <p>VU offers OSHC which meets the Australian Government requirements for overseas students. It is available at a very competitive rate and offers wider coverage than you are able to purchase by yourself or through a third party. You can see what is included in the OSHC offered by VU on the Medibank OSHC website at medibankoshc.com.au.</p> <p>If you want to arrange health insurance through another provider, they should carefully compare the premium fee and the items covered by the insurance, since some health insurance policies do not cover all expenses that you may incur in the course of medical treatment.</p> <p>AUSTRALIAN WORKING HOLIDAY VISA HOLDERS For students applying for a Working Holiday Visa, we recommend the following health cover: Medibank - medibank.com.au/overseas-health-insurance/working-holiday-visas/#why-medibank OSHC cannot be purchased if you intend to apply for a Working Holiday visa.</p>
Visa Information	<p>Exchange and Study Abroad students applying for a student visa require a CoE (Confirmation of Enrolment) from Victoria University. The CoE is issued after receipt of the student's acceptance form and after payment of the tuition fees (if applicable). Students from certain countries may be able to apply for a working holiday visa instead of a student visa. Students applying for a working holiday visa do not require a CoE. Local Transportation	<p>Victoria operates using a cashless ticketing system called myki. After purchasing a reloadable myki card, students can use the pass for trains, trams and buses. The average public transport 'concession' (student) rate per day is AU\$4.60, the average adult rate is AU\$9.20.* Daily, weekly and monthly fares are available. ptv.vic.gov.au/tickets/fares/</p> <p>* The concession rate is available for Exchange students only. When Exchange students arrive in Melbourne they can apply for the myki concession rates.</p>
Arrival Assistance	<p>Victoria University offers incoming students a free pick-up service from Melbourne International Airport to their accommodation. Students need to complete the Airport Reception Request form at least ten days before they intend to arrive in Melbourne. vu.edu.au/request-airport-reception</p>
