How to complete the survey:

- Record the birds you see on campus during the week in the spaces below. This can be at any time across the 5 days.
- Holywell Park is home to buzzards, kingfishers, and water birds. Blue tits, robins and great tits are often found around James France and Village areas. Blackbirds, magpies and wood pigeons could be seen almost anywhere and green woodpeckers have been heard hammering around the Meteorological Station.
- If a bird is simply flying over on a migration route do not record it. Birds circling or hovering above campus, eg buzzards, kestrels etc can be recorded.
- If you see any birds or wildlife (not on the form), then record them in the box at the bottom. Feel free to take pictures!
